Federal Funding Requests

City of Mount Vernon, NY; \$5,000,000

Funds would be used to reconfigure, renovate and construct a Fire Station as the City's Emergency Operations Center.

Clarkson University and ITT; Rome, NY; \$5,000,000

In response to the growing demand for a highly qualified cyber security workforce, several NY colleges and organizations with cyber expertise are teaming to establish the State Cyber Initiative and strengthen the nation's cyber security capabilities. Funds would be used to further this research.

Incorporated Village of Freeport, NY; \$992,666

This project would raise the grade of 4,150 linear feet of South Ocean Avenue, Adams Street, Hamilton Street, Manhattan Street and Richmond Avenue, Freeport, New York to a minimum of 5.0' above mean sea level in order to alleviate tidal flooding.

Securing the Cities program; New York, NY; \$40,000,000

Securing the Cities (STC) is a federally funded effort to protect New York City from the threat of an improvised nuclear device or a radiological dispersal device (dirty bomb). STC was originally proposed by the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in 2006. DHS provides the technical expertise and funding for research and development, while state and local regional partners provide human resources and, in the case of the NYPD, various foundational technical infrastructure systems.

Suffolk County Police Department; Yaphank, NY; \$2,000,000

Funds would be used by the Suffolk County Police Department's Emergency Service Section for a building expansion to provide adequate storage for critical Homeland Security equipment.

Westchester County Department of Emergency Services; Valhalla, NY; \$7,022,000

Funds would be used to develop the capability to receive, store, breakdown and distribute relief supplies, food, water, pharmaceuticals, etc. to address the County's needs during a disaster.
