Dear Under Secretary Brown:

I write today to respectfully request that you declare a major federal disaster area for 14 counties in New York State. As you may know, New York experienced a violent storm last weekend causing damage to homes and infrastructure. After his visit to the regions that suffered damage from the weekend's violent storms, Governor Pataki declared a State Disaster Emergency for the following 14 counties and contiguous areas in New York State; Broome, Chenango, Cortland, Delaware, Greene, Montgomery, Orange, Otsego, Rensselaer, Schenectady, Schoharie, Sullivan, Tioga, and Ulster.

It is my understanding that Governor Pataki is currently seeking aid from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for disaster assistance for the following categories of aid: 1) Individual Assistance for citizens who suffered losses, including the Individual and Households program, disaster unemployment insurance, and Small Business Administration loans; and 2) Public Assistance to reimburse communities for debris removal, emergency response efforts and restoration of public infrastructure to the following counties in New York State

Reported rainfall amounts from across the state averaged 1-3 inches with much higher totals of 2-4 inches in western New York and 3-6 inches in the Catskill region. As rain-swollen rivers crested and overflowed, roads were closed and hundreds of residents were forced to evacuate their homes.

Residents and businesses recognize that springtime in Upstate New York often brings damaging storms; however, it appears that this spate was especially severe. Already strained by the burden of skyrocketing municipal budgets, these communities simply cannot bear the extra burden placed upon them by severe weather systems. As the storm clouds subside and the sun begins to break through today, I hope you will quickly declare a State of Emergency in these counties so that we can move forward together in seeking federal assistance for these communities. As you are aware, without FEMA's help, the ability of these local governments to deliver the essential services their citizens depend on could be greatly diminished. I understand that FEMA is currently conducting a damage assessment along with State inspectors to determine the impact these storms and flooding had on individuals and communities in the impacted areas. I urge you to grant federal disaster status to these regions and release IA and PA funds to help the families and businesses get back on their feet.

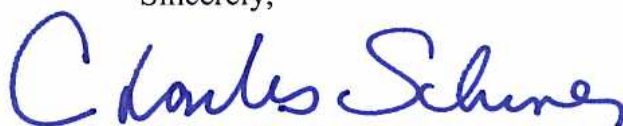
