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## Schumer Study: Loss of State and Local Deductions, Property Tax Deductions Could Raise Taxes on 1.2 Million Upstate New York Households Costing Them Almost \$4.5 billion A Year

Under the proposed changes to the tax code unveiled last week by President Bush's tax panel, the deduction for property, and state and local income tax would be revoked. For high tax states like New York these changes would be devastating potentially costing an estimated 1.2 million taxpayers more than \$4.479 billion in extra property taxes for an average of \$3,589 per household. After California, New York would be hit the hardest by these proposed changes in the tax code.

An estimated 159,586 Capital Region taxpayers could pay an average of \$3,373 more in federal taxes a year if the Bush tax panel proposals were enacted.

The Schumer Survey also divided the proportion of income tax paid by county to get the proportion of tax hike due to the loss of deductions throughout NYS. To arrive at the total NYS amount of tax hike due to the loss of deduction, Schumer multiplied the total 2003 deductions, over \$37 billion, and multiplied that number by 28%, which is the average marginal tax rate for itemizers. To arrive at per household average the Schumer study divided the county tax hike by the estimated itemizer.
