CITY OF OLEAN	THE REQUESTED FUNDS WILL BE UTILIZED TO CONSTRUCT A COMMERCIAL MANUFACTURED NFPA 1402 MULTI-USE FIRE TRAINING FACILITY IN ALLEGANY, NEW YORK ON CITY OF OLEAN PROPERTY LOCATED AT GARGOYLE PARK. THIS IS A SHARED SERVICES VENTURE THAT WILL BENEFIT THE RESIDENTS OF EASTERN CATTARAUGUS AND WESTERN ALLEGANY COUNTIES BY PROVIDING A MULTI-USE FOREFIGHTER TRAINING FACILITY.	CITY OF OLEAN NY	\$362
Canandaigua Emergency Squad, Inc.	Funds for this project will be used to purchase six (6) new Zoll X-Series, or Stryker LIFEPAK 15 advanced life support (ALS) cardiac monitor-defibrillators and automated emergency defibrillators (AEDs). Delaware County	The funding requested will be used for the purpose of installing eight audible early warning systems in the Towns of Colchester and Deposit directly along the East and West Branches of the Delaware River, below two of the largest reservoirs serving the New York City watershed. The dollars will specifically be used to pay for land easements, purchasing the early warning systems and monitoring equipment and installation of the systems. This project is a priority for both the Towns of Deposit and Colchester and has been identified in the Delaware County Multi-Jurisdictional All Hazards Mitigation Plan.	Delaware County NY	\$150
Village of Dundee, Dundee Fire Department	Our 2008 ambulance is due for replacement in the upcoming year and we do not have adequate funds in our equipment reserve fund for replacement of all our trucks and ambulances.	Dundee NY	\$200
SUNY Geneseo	A proposed 20,000+ NSF multi-purpose complex is estimated at \$30M and planned to serve Geneseo and the broader community for health and safety training, job generation, and continuing education. The complex will house several departments including (1) Geneseo First Response, (2) University Police Department, (3) Emergency Management, (4) Parking and Transportation Services, and (5) Video/Access Control to manage UPD's technology programs including IP video, body worn cameras, and the College's electronic access control. It will include a reconfigurable space for community health and safety training such as CPR and wellness courses for all ages. It will also serve as a meeting space for the College and extended Geneseo community.	Geneseo NY	\$10,000
Town of Islip Department of Planning & Development	Replace the existing telecommunication system in order to increase communications with residents, professionals and government officials. The need to decrease response times to emergencies and/or meet the needs of the Town residents requires a more robust telecommunications system allowing for a more mobile work force in meeting the needs of the Town community at large. Village of Sodus Point	This project consists of 4 small efforts to increase the resiliency of the weakest areas of the village: (1) Property Survey & Mitigation Assessment - a complete survey of elevations for all of the potentially vulnerable areas of the Village of Sodus Point. This includes public and private properties. This will facilitate an accurate assessment of the remaining vulnerabilities and provide insight into mitigation needed; (2) Wolcott Street Protection - Construct approximately 700 feet of a vegetated berm along the street. The berm will range in height from 1-2 feet. This project also includes raising the elevation of a driveway that is on the street to insure the street is protected from inundation; (3) Maiden Lane Utility and Landscape for	Sodus Point NY	\$480

Flood Protection - This project would install a storm drain to the new storm water management system, replace and aging water line that services the residents and construct a landscaped berm at the end of the road to keep the water of Great Sodus Bay off the road; and (4) North Parking Lot Protection - This project would reshape the level of the parking lot to prevent waters from Great Sodus Bay coming onto the parking lot. The lot would be regarded so that any water that did come onto the lot would be channeled to the new storm water system. New pavement over mostly existing stone base would then be applied.

All of these areas have seen significant decline as a result of the 2017 and 2019 high water events. We are looking to protect our roadways and newly installed storm water system. The Village has taken advantage of the NYS REDI program and is currently implementing four other mitigation projects.
